2. All entries are to be made on Monday, September 30. Please note that some exhibits to be judged have special times they are to be brought to the fairgrounds.
3. All livestock entries must be brought by Monday, September 30 at 6:00 PM.
4. Entries for the pet show only may be made on the day of the show.
5. A copy of the entry form is located at the end of this catalog. Please fill out this form completely with all exhibits you intend to enter. Please be sure you have selected the correct Class number and Premium number as some premiums are reserved for only adults or only juniors.
6. You must obtain an exhibitor number from the Winn Parish Extension Office to fill out the entry form. Please call (318) 628-4528 to obtain your exhibitor number.
  - a. Livestock exhibitors must obtain this number by September 6, 2024.
7. You may make copies of the entry form if you have more entries than will fit on a single page. However, you must have all exhibits to be entered listed on an entry form. Handwritten copies of entry forms, or any other lists will not be accepted.

3. Sorting will be held September 14.
  - a. This is the date that 3G Cattle Co. already has booked as the Sorting Class for Parish Fair. Participants will need to be aware that they are competing in the 3G Sorting and earning points for the Fair so they will be responsible for paying the cattle fee at the sorting. Please be aware that entry into the sorting is not free and will require payment to participate. Contestants will be eligible for payout from 3G that day as well as earning their Fair points. We will receive the standings for that day from 3G and be able to convert them to our Fair placings for that class.



4. Open to Winn, Jackson, and Grant Parish Residents.
5. There will be no jackpot classes.
6. The superintendent may delete at his discretion any performance events. If you have any questions, contact Donny Moon at 318-628-4528.

7. HORSE SHOW RULES:

- a. To participate in high point exhibitor and receive a buckle you must declare one horse and participate in showmanship, halter/performance, and speed events.
- b. Pre-registration for all classes will be turned into the Winn Parish Extension Office on or before September 6.
- c. Exhibitors must have a negative Coggins report on all horses exhibited.
- d. Copy of Registration or Grade Horse Certificate must be completed and on file with the Winn Parish Extension Office.
- e. Horses must be registered in the name of the exhibitor or immediate family member.
- f. All classes will be awarded ribbons for 1st-5th place. Premiums will only be paid for 1st-3rd places.
- g. Champion, Reserve Champion, and Halter will receive ribbons from the Fair Board and trophies from the Winn Riding Association. High Point Buckles will be award in Senior, Junior, and Beginner categories.

The exhibitor is responsible for the care and handling of their exhibit and is part of the showmanship class. Parents/Guardians must stay back in the spectator area until your child has completed the class. Any helping, hollering, or trying to help your child in any way will get the exhibitor disqualified as this class solely relies on the exhibitor.
