

# Understanding the June 27, 2026 Election in Winn Parish

There are **three parts** to this election.  
Your eligibility to vote for certain races depends upon your  
**registered party** and your **registered address**.

## **Part 1: Closed Party Primary**

Eligibility:

Eligibility to vote in this part is determined by the political party to which you are registered. In this Primary election, the Democratic Party members and the Republican Party members will be choosing a candidate to represent them in the November 3, 2026 election where a candidate will be chosen to take office. The Primary election is only about who gets to run in the General election. Those voters who are registered as No Party may choose to vote in either the Democratic, Republican, or neither of these primaries. (This does not change the voter's registered party.) No Party voters who chose to participate in a Party Primary in May will vote in the same Party Primary for June. No Party voters who chose the Unaffiliated ballot or did not vote in the May 16 election may still choose to vote in a Party Primary or an Unaffiliated ballot. Those voters who are registered as any party other than Democratic or Republican are not eligible to vote in the Closed Party Primary part of this election.

## **Part 2: City of Winnfield Municipal Elections**

Eligibility:

Eligibility to vote in this part is determined by the registered address of the voter, regardless of party. Those voters who are registered at an address within the municipality of Winnfield will be eligible to vote for mayor as well as the city council member of the district within which they reside. Those registered outside the municipality of Winnfield are not eligible to vote in this part of the election.

Races on the ballot:

City Council Member, District 2 or 5

## **Part 3: School Board Proposition**

Eligibility:

All registered voters, regardless of party, who reside in the Winnfield or Atlanta School Tax Districts are eligible to vote in this part of the election.

<b>Part 3: School Board Proposition</b>			
<p><i>Consolidated School District No. 12 Proposition (Bond)</i></p> <p><i>Shall Consolidated School District No. 12 of the Parish of Winn, State of Louisiana (the "District"), incur debt and issue bonds not exceeding \$23,000,000, in one or more series, to run not exceeding 20 years from date thereof, with interest at a rate not exceeding 7% per annum, for the purpose of financing capital expenditures for school purposes for the District, including constructing, acquiring and/or improving schools and other school related facilities, including construction of a new gymnasium at Winnfield Senior High School and renovations and additional classrooms at Winnfield Middle School, together with equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public; which bonds will be general obligations of the District and will be payable from ad valorem taxes to be levied and collected in the manner provided by Article VI, Section 33 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and statutory authority supplemental thereto, with an estimated 30 mills to be levied in the first year of issue to pay said bonds?</i></p>
